TULIPS FIELDS

A journey to discover the secrets of the Welsh Route, marvel at the nature of Los Alerces National Park, and experience the beauty of being in a tulip field.

WELSH ROUTE: VISIT TO THE TULIP FIELD

Includes: transportation from Esquel to Trevelin, insurance, Spanish-speaking guide, and tickets to: Nant y Fall waterfalls, Nant Fache Mill, and the tulip field.

The itinerary showcases the history, production, flavors, and landscapes that make up the beautiful Route 259, the road connecting Esquel, Trevelin, and the border with Chile. The tour begins in Trevelin, Welsh for "mill town," the epicenter of Welsh culture. From here, visitors can explore not only the centuries-old Bethel Chapel but also the town center—consisting of an octagonal square that, along with the converging diagonals, gives it the shape of a mill's blades. The route continues to the Nant y Fall waterfalls, and at the next destination, all the Patagonian spring beauty is uniquely displayed in the tulip fields. October is the month when these flowers bloom, dressing the countryside in a rainbow of colors and aromas. At the end of the tour, continuing toward Chile, we'll visit the Nant Fach mill, a reconstruction of the old Welsh mills from the early 20th century, when the valley gained international recognition for its exceptional wheat production. We'll also see artifacts in excellent condition that were part of the daily life of the early Welsh.

LOS ALERCES NATIONAL PARK

Time: Departure 9:30 AM - Return 6:00 PM.

Includes: Transportation from Esquel, insurance, and a professional Spanish-speaking guide, entrance to Los Alerces National Park, and a picnic lunch and drinks.

The tour begins at 9:30 a.m. in Esquel and heads toward Villa Futalaufquen, the administrative headquarters and superintendency of Los Alerces National Park. From there, we'll head to Puerto Limonao and arrive at a must-see for lovers of fine architecture: the Hostería Futalaufquen, an emblematic building by the famous Buenos Aires native Alejandro Gabriel Bustillo Madero. From there, a vehicle will await us, taking us to a rocky wall covered in cave paintings over 2,000 years old. After a short drive, we'll climb to the top of a hill that offers a privileged panoramic view of Lake Futalaufquen and continue on to the Irigoyen waterfall. The next stage reveals the heart of the park; the Arrayanes River walkway is perfect for spectacular photographs. After crossing the watercourse, we will visit a "young" larch tree that is estimated to be almost as old as the Industrial Revolution, as well as glimpse the Menendez River and finally reach Puerto Chucao, on Lake Menendez, which from its shore surprises with an unobstructed view of the majestic Torrecillas glacier.
